English

Challenge yourself - using runes can you write a short paragraph explaining who the Anglo-Saxons were and where they came from?

History

Find out about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings in general, who were they? Where did they come from? Were there any similarities or differences between them? Can you produce a fact file?

Geography

Find out about Scandinavia, which is where the Vikings came from.

What is it like there? Would you like to go there for a holiday? Make a Viking holiday brochure?

Art

Research what the Bayeux
Tapestry is. Can you recreate a
section of the tapestry by
drawing, colouring or painting it
with watercolours?

Can you make a handmade loom and weave a pattern out of wool?

Science

Think about how the Vikings travelled in long boats - how were these made...could you make a model that floats and investigate how much it can hold before it sinks?

Research, design and make a Viking mask or helmet to bring in.
