We have a proven track record of supporting children with complex needs within our school in a caring and nurturing environment.

Our Core Offer:

Stanwick Primary is able to offer a variety of educational and well-being support systems

Within our Foundation Class:

- Home visits for all children to aid the transition process
- Childcare Setting /Child-minder visit to aid the transition, if appropriate
- Graduated transition into fulltime school
- Regular Parental information evenings to keep parents informed
- Parents encouraged to participate in school life

Across the School:

- All staff are trained in using the 1,2,3 Magic programme
- An early years Specialist Teacher in our Foundation class
- We have a Teacher specialising in Visual Impairment
- We have a qualified NVQ assessor within school
- Access to support services provided by the Nene Education Trust
- Higher level Teaching Assistants that are available to work across all year groups

Accessibility:

Stanwick Primary school is situated within a village with direct access to neighbouring Raunds and Higham Ferrers. The Village is situated to the south of the A45 trunk road easily linking with the A14. The school grounds incorporates its own car park and is wheelchair friendly, we also have a wheelchair accessible toilet centrally situated.

Links With The Local Community.

Stanwick school works closely with outside local business and support organisations.

The school has its own wrap- around care to provide before and after school care to children from across the school. The 'Sunshine Club' is open from 7.30am – 6pm throughout the school year.

The school has close links within the area with local child-minding services that provide care for children that attend our school.

Stanwick Primary offers after school activities to the students to cater for a variety of outside interests.

The school is keen to promote its relationship with local business and organisations to bring a variety knowledge and support to our school community.

Our Sports Before and After School Clubs are accessible to all our students and everyone is encouraged to participate in our sessions to support their self-confidence and provide further opportunity to develop their social skills and friendships.

The school maintains up to date contacts with Parental Support Groups that may be of benefit to our students and their families.

Stanwick Primary is part of the Nene Education Trust and this enables the school to have direct links and a seamless transition into our local senior school.

SEND Environment

Stanwick school provides a whole school inclusive environment where everyone is included in all parts of the curriculum and extra-curricular activities regardless of their abilities.

Where appropriate a risk assessment will be carried out to ensure their safety and security at all times.

The children are involved in developing the extra-curricular activities and are able to share ideas of how they can directly help and support others to be involved.

Working Together

Stanwick Primary Academy enjoys working together with the parents and carers to ensure each and every child can access the curriculum and enjoy school life.

The child's class teacher works closely with the child's family to liaise and keep them informed of their progress by agreeing appropriate targets.

Our students with Special Educational Needs (SEN) will have their targets recorded within their Individual Education Plan (IEP) and these are reviewed each term to monitor their clear progression path.

The school has a Qualified Special Educational Needs Co-Ordinator (SENCO), and Inclusion Manager on site to oversee the progression of the individual children, and support their families.

Parents are encouraged to attend our Parents Evenings where they can discuss their child's progression with the Class Teacher, SENCO and Inclusion Manager.

School Transition

Throughout your child's time at Stanwick Primary the school will be working closely with your child to prepare them for change.

Transitions into the next year group and key stage are planned carefully and individual children may need a more gradual approach to their transition, this may include extra visits to their new school and individual time to get to know key personell.

When planning the transition to the next school we work closely with the school and support staff to ensure a well-planned and successful move.

We work towards a smooth transition for all children and where individual children may need extra support, we plan a programme in advance with the new school and family to make sure that the children are comfortable with the process.

When a child is transfer into Stanwick Primary a meeting between everyone involved is held to identify where we can help the move and support the family.

Support Programmes

At Stanwick Primary we are able to be flexible to the needs of individual children and be creative when trying to support them.

We are currently using a variety of programmes to include:

- 1,2,3 Magic behavioural support programme for Parents
- 1:1 Counselling via local organisation Service 6
- Toe by Toe reading programme
- Individual interventions
- Small group interventions
- Booster classes
- Play buddies
- Play mentor
- Mindfulness and well-being support
- Literacy interventions
- Maths interventions
- Nurture sessions

We are also able to access outside agencies programmes to help us to support you within school or at home.
