



ENGLISH

Our English work this term will be linked heavily to our topic. Our class text shall be 'War Horse' by Michael Morpurgo. Inspired by this text and having looked at the specific features of each genre, the children will be writing letters, flashback stories and wartime poetry. This book will also be the basis of our reading lessons in which we shall teach each of the 'VIPERS' skills needed for reading.

Our value this term is '**Teamwork**'. We will consider the definition of teamwork and the children will have the opportunity to take part in a variety of activities that promote good teamwork. Children will be encouraged to show how they can be part of a team in a variety of ways.



PE

The children will have PE on a Tuesday and Friday, for 10 weeks in the Autumn terms, we will be going swimming on a Tuesday afternoon. Please see more details about this in your welcome letter.

PSHE

This term, the children will be completing Puzzle Piece 1 which is 'Being Me in My World.' They will be exploring their goals for the year ahead and how to manage their fears and worries for the future.

COMPUTING

The children will be taught Computing by Mrs Pearson. This term, the focus will be on e-safety before the children begin more practical work in future terms.



MATHEMATICS

We will start the year by looking at place value. In Year 6, this includes numbers up to 10 000 000. We will then move onto the four operations to make sure all children are confident to solve problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. The next topic after this is fractions. We will be completing additional arithmetic work each week.



ART AND DT

The children will be using their sketchbooks to record observations. This term, we will be focussing on portraits of famous figures from WW1 and also self-portraits.



Curriculum Information

Term 1

TOPIC

We will investigate the history of World War One and discover what led up to the start of one of the largest wars in history. The children will additionally explore what life was like for the soldiers on the front line as well as what life was like at home for the women and children who kept Britain running. The children will be challenged to discuss the significance of events within the war and how alliances between countries, power-hungry empires and the assassination of an archduke began WWI.
